<p>Course summary</p> <p>The graduate will be able to expertly handle i) the management, hygiene and economic issues related to livestock farms, ii) the treatment of foodstuff of animal origin, and iii) issues related to the conservation and management of wildlife, with particular regards to the development and application of suitable managing methods.</p>
<p>Learning objectives</p> <p>Provide students with the basic knowledge of the contents and the etiology, pathogenesis and mechanisms of onset and development of major diseases related to alterations of the structure and function of different organs and systems.</p>
<p>Tutorship activities</p> <p>The tutoring service assists students throughout their course of studies through reception, assistance to the study, advice on study and on training and support in finding information about mobility, about scholarships in Italy and abroad, and specific education opportunities (grants, cooperative agreements, etc.)</p>
<p>Lab activities</p> <p>The course of study includes practical activity in the necropsy room, in groups of 10-15 students followed by a tutor, developing post-mortem examination of domestic and wild animals, as well as examination and diagnosis on organs with lesions.</p>
<p>Other activities besides the course: i.e. seminars and conferences addressed to PhD students and research fellows, dissemination conferences</p> <p>No other activities are included in this course of study.</p>

<p>Visiting Professor Profile</p> <p>The Visiting Professor must have a DVM degree, and a consolidated postdoctoral research and teaching experience in veterinary pathology.</p> <p>The curriculum shall demonstrate a teaching experience of at least 10 years at an academic institution (Faculty/School of Veterinary Medicine) in general pathology, small and large animal gross pathology, histopathology, and avian pathology.</p>

Language skills shall include good spoken and written Italian language.
